

Drawing I Introduction Drawing (One Semester)

Instructor: Patty Ryan

Prerequisite is successful completion of Art I

Instructor Recommendation: Suggests that student take Drawing Foundations before Painting.

Description: This course is a beginning level class that guides students in developing and building basic drawing skills. Students will draw from life, figure drawing, perspective and illustration. Students will use a variety of media such as pencil, marker, chalk, pastels, scratchboard, charcoal, and pen & ink. Artists will demonstrate a sincere desire to explore a variety of ideas and problems. Students will explore life and artworks of various artists. Students will learn to self-assess their work. Students will collect their artwork for their portfolios. Students will keep a drawing book. Student must display their work at the Spring Art Show.

Materials: Bring a pencil to class everyday! Bring a lock for in the art room. Store a folder in the classroom.
