Course Description

Course content includes:

This is a performance based class, rehearsing music from the 1920's to the contemporary. Students will also be expected to improve their sight-reading skills with their knowledge of basic music theory and interval training. Students will also build a base of scales and modes to improvise solos to various jazz styles.

Course Pre-Requisite(s)

To be a member of the Jazz Ensemble, students must be in Concert/Marching Band or be allowed to join as recommended by the director. Any student who is not in Concert/Marching Band must audition for the director.

Activities and Assignments
