- ♦ Financial reporting covers all actual revenues and expenditures through July 31, 2019. All trending data is offered from most recent historical data. Enrollment data is offered progressively with two additional years of experience for trending purposes.
- $\Diamond$  We have completed one month in the new fiscal year. It is too early to comment on trends with only one month's data. Revenue timing is ahead due to the tax advance being obtained in July. The general fund unencumbered cash balance on 7/31/2019 was \$6,196,867.
- ♦ Donations for the month of July 2019 \$1,510 with the majority of the donations for Football Scholarships.
- ♦ The periodic negative balances for State/Federal/Local funding are awaiting deposits from ODE. Looking closely at federal and state programs offered through ODE to be sure to have appropriate budgets/expenses in place to close out the fiscal year.
- ♦ In this time of economic uncertainty, Huron City School District must adhere to strict spending disciplines in order to offset the continued volatility in revenues, foundation adjustments and enrollment fluctuations.






